5 – 10 min	<ul> <li>Stage aim: Revision, settling in</li> <li>Kids introduce themselves, say hi to everyone</li> <li>Let's count everyone (boys, girls, noses)</li> </ul>	No materials
10 – 15 min	Stage aim: New material  • Angelina makes an appearance, says hello to kid	Rucksack with all the materials, taking then out, one at a time

- Kids ask chorally: Angelina, what's in the bag?, T takes out one bit, introduces its name and introduces and models the sentence in the Present Continous and the gesture, the kids take part, too (a structure + a gesture), all the objects / sentences one by one, with a lot of repetition
- Revise all the gestures + sentences
- Open your eyes (aka the disappearing object): all the objects in the centre of the circle, kids close the eyes, T removes one of the objects, kids open the eyes, guess, we reproduce the sentence + the gesture again
- Revise all the gestures + sentences again

All the objects + sentences we used in that lesson (there is a lot more potential here, the list here was determined by what realia I had available)

In the format of: the object + the gesture + the sentence

- A straw hat: putting on a hat and walking: We are going to the beach
- A sun cream: smearing it on the forearms and lying down: We are sunbathing
- A coin: eating an ice-cream:
   We are eating an ice-cream
- A towel: moving your arms:
   We are swimming
- A bottle of water: drinking: We are drinking
- A shell: looking around: We are looking for shells
- A storybook: reading an invisible book: We are reading a book

Even though some of the associations might seem a bit farfetched, the kids were able to make the connection (ie the coins = eating

20 – 25 min	<ul> <li>Stage aim: Focused task: We are going to the beach</li> <li>Kids stand up in a circle</li> <li>T says: We are going to the beach (we all put out hats on the head)</li> <li>Everyone turns to the right, to stand behind a friend, in a circle and we start walking</li> <li>T chants: We are going to the beach, we are going to the beach, everyone walks.</li> <li>T says 'Let's sit down. What are we going to do?'</li> <li>Kids take turns to suggest what to do next, the teacher announces 'We are sunbathing' and everyone is miming the activity, just the way we did before.</li> <li>We go through all the activities, then we stand up in a circle and we go back home. T chants 'We are going home'</li> </ul>	It is fun to shout 'Stop. Can you see the beach?' a few times. In our lesson, we basically made a full circle.  On walking home, we made another full circle.  The kids would mostly produce single words and phrases but everyone took part in the TPR. I hope that if we had more time and if we could work on the content over a few lessons, that part would have been more successful.  Initially, I wanted to play the sea sounds in the background while being on the beach but that turned out not to be possible so I gave up.
